JUNE DEVOTIONAL

John the Baptist's Final Question

I had planned to write a June Devotional comparing Jesus' hometown synagogue scripture-reading and preaching (Luke 4:16-20) with the source of His sermon-text, Isaiah 61:1-3, but The Holy Sprit led me to Matthew 11:1-5, instead.

"Now it came to pass, when Jesus finished commanding His twelve disciples, that He departed from there to teach and to preach in their cities.

And when John had heard in prison about the works of Christ, he sent two of his disciples ³ and said to Him, "Are You the Coming One, or do we look for another?"

Jesus answered and said to them, "Go and tell John the things which you hear and see: The blind see and the lame walk; the lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear; the dead are raised up and the poor have the gospel preached to them."

Verses 4-5 refer to the fact that Jesus performed miracles which were predicted centuries earlier by the Prophet Isaiah: Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened and the ears of the deaf shall be unstopped. Then shall the lame man leap as an hart. (Isaiah 35: 5-6a KJV)

The Holy Spirit has something to say to us from the prisoner John the Baptist!

When John heard in prison what The Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples and said to Him, are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another? (Matthew 11:2-3 NRSV)

Jesus' reply to John fulfills scriptural prophecy and, over two thousand years later, can fill with delight anyone who reads it, whatever the language or translation!

Jesus replied: Go back and report to John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cured, the deaf hear, the dead are raised and good news is preached to the poor. (Matthew 11: 4-5 NIV)

We have but to thumb back through the preceding chapters of Matthew —or consult any of the gospels— for the exciting details of Jesus Christ's ministry on earth.

But what about John the Baptist? Didn't he know who Jesus was? Wasn't John filled with the Holy Spirit before he was even born? Scripture tells us that his parents were:

When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. (Luke 1:41NIV) As soon as he insisted on God's name for their baby, Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit. (Luke 1:67a NIV)

Let us pause and review Chapter 1 of Mark and Chapters 3 of Matthew and Luke and ask ourselves if that John, the Desert Preacher of Repentance for Forgiveness of Sins and Water Baptism by Immersion, knew who Jesus was! Mark 1:7-9 tells us how John predicted One, the thongs of whose sandals John was unworthy to stoop

down and untie, would come and baptize with the Holy Spirit; that One was Jesus, whom John baptized!

But John's fiery preaching offended someone in power, King Herod, who put John in prison to shut him up! (Luke 3: 19-20) Did prison put doubt in John's mind? What dungeons of doubt cloud our minds today? Mine is self-pity; what's yours? Or did prison give John time to think? Thinking needn't leave us in doubt; it can lead us into prayer, both personal and communal, where God's Holy Spirit can move our spirits..

Look at brave John the Baptist who loved his own disciples so much that, sensing he was going to die, sent them to Jesus Christ, the author of Eternal Life, the Messiah God had promised, the Miracle Worker the prophets had predicted! John's disciples now had the option of becoming Jesus' Disciples! May we take that option. Jesus, The Way out of prison and doubt. The Answer to our greatest questions!



MISSIONARY OF THE MONTH

COMINAD
(Cooperative Mission Network of
the African Dispersion)

One of the projects that COMINAD is currently working on is developing a mission preparedness plan for prospective missionaries, originally from Haiti, who have a 3-year commitment as full-time missionaries to Northern Benin.

This northern region of Benin is in the 10/40 window and has limited to no missionaries in place to evangelize the people. How wonderful would it be to have two of their own come back to tell them of the ultimate story of forgiveness and reconciliation, through the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Update: Since the Project began, still in communication with people responsible to the missionaries. Three missionaries kidnapped in Haiti and has not arrived to Benin and went back to Cap Haitian (home). They still want to go to Africa. The situation is worse now, they still working on their passports visas because they have to get those again. The project is still going.

People are ministering to Muslims and unreached people group in Benin.

When it comes mobilizing missionaries within COMiNAD, many churches haven't recovered. Part of their work was mobilizing churches and they had issues mobilizing churches due to COVID. They have had issues because churches are more in need of bringing their churches back from COVID.

Prayer Requests: Blood Pressure issues for the past few months. Doing physical therapy, been having medical issues. Praise God: God has answered our prayers in 2023 and was able to sell house and move to VA.. He is in need of additional \$300 for resources to move.

Say it loud, I'm black and I'm proud! But with all my pride in heritage as an African American, I knew little of Black History until the activism of the 60's. Even after all this time, Juneteenth was not on my radar until a couple years ago. So, we were determined for this June issue to highlight Juneteenth.

Believe it or not, there are detractors as to whether or not we should celebrate Juneteenth, and that is for another time. The concern for this issue is simply acknowledging it and looking at it from the perspective as followers of Jesus Christ. Below is an edited version of an article from *Christianity Today* by Rasoon Berry of Brooklyn.

For Christians, Juneteenth Is a Time of Jubilee

Observing Juneteenth as a national holiday affirms what we believe about our faith and our freedoms.

Over two and a half years passed between President Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation and when the first of those enslaved in Texas tasted freedom: 900 more days why does Juneteenth matter to the church?

The times set aside to celebrate and reflect reveal what matters to society then, now, and in the future. For instance, Pilgrims in early America set apart "days of thanksgiving" to express gratitude to God for his providential grace—a tradition that was formalized into the national calendar in 1863 with Abraham Lincoln's official proclamation of Thanksgiving Day "to heal the wounds of the nation" divided by war.

But an even earlier civically inspired sacred tradition was

inadvertently established less than a year prior on December 31, 1862—when congregations of Black Christians gathered for "Watch Night" services on what they called "Freedom's Eve.

Black churches across the country met to worship, pray, and thank God for the freedom that came to their brethren on January 1, 1863, when the Emancipation Proclamation went into effect. But it would be another two years after the first Watch Night service before this proclamation of freedom became a reality in the last holdout state of Texas.

The arrival of Union troops in Galveston, Texas, was a watershed moment in the nation's history and included thousands of Black soldiers—some recently freed themselves—who had joined the military unit. The next day, General Gordon Granger announced General Order No. 3: an "absolute equality of personal rights and rights of property between former masters and slaves."

The news spread like wildfire, and nicknames for the day proliferated as well: Emancipation Day, Freedom Day, Juneteenth, and so on. one of the first names given to the commemoration was Jubilee Day.

That these newly emancipated Americans referred to the day as Jubilee meant they understood their deliverance not only in a physical sense but also in a spiritual sense—no doubt seeing connections between their liberation and God's deliverance of Israel from over 400 years slavery in Egypt.

It is always good for Christians to celebrate freedom. The end of the evil institution of slavery in our midst is valuable and valid no matter how messy and incomplete it is. There's a renewal possible with a celebration such as Juneteenth—it's a reminder of where we've been and hopefully where we're going.

The apostle Paul instructed the church in Rome to "rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn" (Rom. 12:15), and Juneteenth provides a unique national moment to do both. We can "rejoice with those who rejoice" because freedom is a good gift from God that honors the image-bearing nature of humanity.

Many African Americans like me don't know a specific date when our ancestors were freed. Although our nation's population includes millions of people whose descendants are just a few generations removed from those who were enslaved or enslavers, we have not previously made time in our civic calendar of traditions to collectively reflect on the history of slavery and emancipation and its importance today.

Juneteenth gives us that opportunity. It is a historical reminder that invites us to continue "to proclaim freedom for the captives" (Isa. 61:1; Luke 4:18


When Jesus read from Isaiah 61, he declared that he had come "to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor" (Luke 4:19)—that in him, the Jubilee promises of holistic deliverance were fully manifest.

Jesus demonstrated this by healing the body and soul of the poor, the captives, the blind, and the oppressed—but he ultimately revealed it in his death and resurrection, promising to raise to life whoever believes in him. Jesus himself is our Jubilee.

Juneteenth is something for which the whole church can say "Amen!"—and I pray we continue to experience more of the freedom and faith Jesus offers us as we celebrate.


JUNETEENTH FLAG
