MARCH DEVOTIONAL

THE JOY OF THE LORD



ay the hope-inspiring God so fill you with perfect JOY and peace through your continuing faith, that you may bubble over with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. Romans 15:13 The Williams Translation

After "Strong Hope" last month, I wanted to write you about joy and the Joy of The Lord, which we need so much now! Please let me share what I learned from preparing a sermon I preached to a small Spanish-speaking congregation on February 16; the

passage they had me use was Luke 6:17-26. I sensed The Lord leading me to verses 22 and 23.

What struck me most was Jesus telling His disciples to rejoice when they were mistreated for Christ's Sake!



The New Testament was originally written in Greek. The Greek word for "joy" in Verse 23 is *skirtan*. *Skirtan* is what some baby animals do when they discover they can run: they jump for joy! The English translation specifies "to skip like young calves" and to "gambol" (frolic) like little lambs!

So, this is how Jesus wants us to behave when we're insulted for being observant Christians? Is this as hard for you to understand as it is for me? Frankly, I never understood "The Joy of The Lord" at all until I joined *La Iglesia Bautista*, The Baptist Church of Malaga, Spain, in 1973 and got to know Pastor Luis Hombre, his wife and children. At times I saw that pastor skip for joy! They all bubbled over with happiness, but particularly, Pastor Luis Hombre: he was walking, talking, preaching, teaching, joking, laughing—Joy Personified! I'd never, ever found such genuine joy in one person!

When my parents visited me in 1974, my dad, a pastor, met privately with Pastor Hombre and a missionary who interpreted for them. Later Dad told Mom and me that after the Spanish Civil War ended in 1939, General Franco enacted "mop-up operations" all over Spain. For example, crowds of Socialists were rounded up in every town and shot dead in the local bullring. Non-Catholic pastors were persecuted.

Luis, 16, his mother and sisters were forced to watch while soldiers tortured their father, finally killing him for refusing to recant his Baptist beliefs or to say The Hail Mary.

I was stunned. How could anyone survive such an ordeal with their wits in tact, much less live life with Joy? Yet this is what Luis Hombre did: he became a pastor like his father, preached every Sunday and got arrested every Monday until tourism began changing Spain in the 1960's.

I pray that none of us have to suffer for our faith the way the Hombre family did, but oh, that we Christians can learn to live with the Joy I saw in them!

In the meantime, we can start with the Word of God. There is so much joy in The Bible! In The New Strong's Concordance of The Bible, the word "joy," in small print, takes up an entire printed column and a half, from I Samuel to Jude 24, with verses like these:

The joy of the lord is your strength. –Nehemiah 8:10
In Thy Presence is fullness of joy. – Psalm 16: 11
Eat thy bread with joy. – Ecclesiastes 9:7
Increase their joy in The Lord.—Isaiah 29:19
I will joy in The God of my salvation. – Habakkuk 3:18
Enter thou into the joy of thy Lord. – Matthew 25:21
...to Jerusalem with great joy. – Luke 24:52

manda Gorman is an award-winning writer and cum laude graduate of Harvard University, where she studied Sociology. She has written for the New York Times and has three books forthcoming with Penguin Random House.

Born and raised in Los Angeles, she began writing at only a few years of age. Now her words have won her invitations to the Obama White House and to perform for Lin-Manuel Miranda, Al Gore, Secretary Hillary Clinton, Malala Yousafzai, and others. Amanda has performed multiple commissioned poems for CBS This Morning and she has spoken at events and venues across the country, including the Library of Congress and Lincoln Center. She has received a Genius Grant from OZY Media, as well as recognition from Scholastic Inc., YoungArts, the *Glamour* magazine College Women of the Year Awards, and the Webby Awards. She has written for the *New York Times* newsletter *The Edit* and penned the manifesto for Nike's 2020 Black History Month campaign. In 2017, Amanda Gorman was appointed the first-ever National Youth Poet Laureate by

Urban Word – a program that supports Youth Poets Laureate in more than 60 cities, regions and states nationally. She is the recipient of the Poets & Writers Barnes & Noble Writers for Writers Award, and is the youngest board member of 826 National, the largest youth writing network in the United States.

She composed and read *The Hill We Climb* was composed and read for the Inauguration of President Joe Biden, January 2021. She is the first person to be named the National Youth Poet Laureate and the youngest inaugural poet in US history. She was 23 years old.

The Hill We Climb is spoken word poem. Read it aloud and relish the rhythms, rhymes, and alliteration word play. Enjoy! If you happen to feel that you're reading something relevant for today, that's what poets do.

hen day comes we ask ourselves, where can we find light in this never- ending shade? The loss we carry, a sea we must wade. We've braved the belly of the beast, we've learned that quiet isn't always peace and the norms and notions of what just is, isn't always justice. And yet the dawn is ours before we knew it, somehow we do it, somehow we've weathered and witnessed a nation that isn't broken but simply unfinished.

We, the successors of a country and a time where a skinny black girl descended from slaves and raised by a single mother can dream of becoming president only to find herself reciting for one. And, yes, we are far from polished, far from pristine, but that doesn't mean we are striving to form a union that is perfect, we are striving to forge a union with purpose, to compose a country committed to all cultures, colors, characters and conditions of man.

So we lift our gazes not to what stands between us, but what stands before us. We close the divide because we know to put our future first, we must first put our differences aside. We lay down our arms so we can reach out our arms to one another, we seek harm to none and harmony for all.

Let the globe, if nothing else, say this is true: that even as we grieved, we grew, even as we hurt, we hoped, that even as we tired, we tried, that we'll forever be tied together victorious, not because we will never again know defeat but because we will never again sow division.

Scripture tells us to envision that everyone shall sit under their own vine and fig tree and no one should make them afraid.* If we're to live up to our own time, then victory won't lie in the blade, but in in all of the bridges we've made.

That is the promise to glade, the hill we climb if only we dare it because being American is more than a pride we inherit, it's the past we step into and how we repair it. We've seen a force that would shatter our nation rather than share it. That would destroy our country if it meant delaying democracy, and this effort very nearly succeeded. But while democracy can periodically be delayed, but it can never be permanently defeated.

In this truth, in this faith, we trust, for while we have our eyes on the future, history has its eyes on us, this is the era of just redemption we feared in its inception we did not feel prepared to be the heirs of such a terrifying hour but within it we found the power to author a new chapter, to offer hope and laughter to ourselves, so while once we asked how can we possibly prevail over catastrophe, now we assert how could catastrophe possibly prevail over us.

We will not march back to what was but move to what shall be, a country that is bruised but whole, benevolent but bold, fierce and free, we will not be turned around or interrupted by intimidation because we know our inaction and inertia will be the inheritance of the next generation, our blunders become their burden. But one thing is certain: if we merge mercy with might and might with right, then love becomes our legacy and change our children's birthright.

So let us leave behind a country better than the one we were left, with every breath from my bronze, pounded chest, we will raise this wounded world into a wondrous one, we will rise from the golden hills of the West, we will rise from the windswept Northeast where our forefathers first realized revolution, we will rise from the lake-rimmed cities of the Midwestern states, we will rise from the sunbaked South, we will rebuild, reconcile, and recover in every known nook of our nation in every corner called our country our people diverse and beautiful will emerge battered and beautiful, when the day comes we step out of the shade aflame and unafraid, the new dawn blooms as we free it, for there is always light if only we're brave enough to see it, if only we're brave enough to be it.

The Last Word

The Hills They Climbed

"Who knows, perhaps you have come to your royal position for such a time as this." Esther 4:14 (HCSB)

"I will go to the king even if it is against the law. If I perish, I perish." Esther 4:16 (HCSB)

The Hill We Climb is Amanda Gorman's luminous work of unflinching honesty and engaging wisdom about our country. Poetic and insightful, her words strike to the heart of brutish realities yet fasten onto hope. Hope in the midst of struggle when the outcome is uncertain, yet that same searing ground can become the soil out of which better futures grow. A theme that applies to wider landscapes than America.

This month we honor women throughout history. Over 250 appear in the Bible. Women as diverse and fascinating as their stories. Esther was an orphaned Jewish girl elevated to Persian royalty and God's instrument to prevent a genocide against her people. Rachel and Leah, birthed nations out of their rivalry. Deborah accompanied an army in battle. Anna was over 90 when she recognized the baby Messiah in the Temple. Ruth gleaned fields she would later own. Hannah prayed so fervently the priest thought she was drunk. Abigail cooled David's temper and headed off a massacre. Jael overcame a seasoned military leader with a tent peg and a cup of buttermilk.

Jesus' family line includes Ruth, a Moabite; Bathsheba, an adulteress; Tamar who disguised herself as a prostitute, and Rahab who *was* one. Even His mother, Mary, faced being quietly divorced by Joseph had it not been for divine intervention to assure him of her innocence.

Women, some that society would've scorned, are counted among patriarchs and kings. Later a grateful woman washed Jesus' feet with her tears. An unclean woman touched the hem of His garment with such faith He felt her draw power out of Him. A shamed woman went to a well to draw water but found the Savior instead.

Women at the cross. Women at the tomb. A woman the first to declare He had risen. Women with watershed moments; with watershed lives. Biblical women had hills that required risk and faith to climb. Women God gave illustrious futures beyond the painful complicated journeys to get there.
