NOTES ON CBC'S THE JOURNEY TO BECOMING FAST

In preparation for the Journey to Becoming Fast, Pastor Robert Casteline spent two weeks in Sunday School on the subject of fasting. I will be sharing from some of my notes taken during the classes.

What is Fasting?

Fasting is abstaining for spiritual purposes. Traditionally it is abstaining from food but in our modern times we can abstain from anything we feel might be controlling us; things that in and of themselves are not bad or sinful, but they can take over time that could be spent engaging in what I like to call the "Whatsoevers" in Philippians 4:8.

Finally, [brothers and sisters], whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest [noble], whatsoever things are just [right], whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of

The Harmony of the Gospels on Resurrection Sunday

By the time we receive this April Newsletter, we will be in the middle of the Journey to Becoming Fast—giving up some food or activity we love—as we look forward to Holy Week and celebrating the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ!

My Easter prayer is that these delightfully differing details from Mark (said to have been the first Gospel written,) Matthew, Luke and John will enhance your Eastertide! Mark's accounts and Matthew's accounts of the greatest true story every told both supplement and complement each other. Luke and John each give us some unique information!

Because Jesus lived on Earth as a Jew/Rabi/Master Teacher, it is fitting to begin our series of Resurrection Day happenings just after the Sabbath ended (around 6:00 PM Saturday,) so that Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James and Salome could buy spices with which to anoint Jesus' body.

How Will We Roll?

Mark asks the women's question regarding the big rock blocking

the entrance to Jesus' tomb as they approach it "very early on the first day of the week," (Mark 16: 2) and Matthew answers it: Earthquake! "...an angel of The Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled away the stone and sat upon it." (Mt. 28: 2-4)

Matthew 28:3 describes this angel like "lightning," dressed "white as snow." By now the tomb-guards are scared to death, "as dead men" (Mt. 28:4), but only a few verses later (Mt. 28:11-15,) they will run to town, tell the Religious Big Shots everything and be richly bribed by them to say that His disciples stole Jesus' corpse. This lie "was spread abroad among the Jews and continueth until this day." (Mt. 28:15d)

Don't' you think it's time, Brothers and Sisters in Christ, that we told our Jewish Brothers and Sisters here in New York City The Truth?

Mark's "man in a white robe" (Mk.16:5) is, according to Matthew, the angel who told the women not to be afraid as they entered the empty tomb: "...Ye seek Jesus who has been crucified; he is not here, for he has risen, even as he has said. Come see the place where the Lord lay." (Mt.28: 5-7a) The angel then commissions the women to be among the first evangelists of the Living Christ! (*The Woman at the Well was the very first. John 4: 1-42*) Now "go quickly," says Matthew's angel "and tell his disciples (Mt. 28:7; Mark 16:7 adds "and Peter") he is risen from the dead" and that Jesus will meet them in Galilee!

The women obey, running with joy into The Greatest Joy, Jesus

Himself! "And behold, Jesus met them saying, "All hail. And they came and took hold of his feet and worshipped him." (Mt. 28: 19-10) Jesus then sent them running on to tell his brothers to meet him in Galilee! Women were the first to talk with the Resurrected Jesus Christ!

What a glorious Resurrection Day! Sunday morning Jesus meets

the women on the road back from the empty tomb and Sunday afternoon He meets Cleopus and another disciple on The Road to Emmaus! (Luke 24: 13-32)

With Luke we enjoy one of the best writers in the Bible, telling us of two "dazzling "men in the tomb who ask the perplexed women

"why seek ye the living among the dead? He is not here but is risen: remember how he spake to you when he was yet in Galilee " (that he would be) "crucified and the third day rise again. And they remembered his words." (Luke 24: 5-6)

Luke acknowledges all the women evangelists: They ..."returned from the tomb and told all these things to the eleven and to all they met. Now they were Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the mother of James and the other women with them and they told these things unto the apostles." (Luke 24: 9-11)

Luke gives the male disciples' first reaction to the women's Good News: "they disbelieved them" (Lk. 24:11b) Later on, which disciple was the first man to believe that Jesus was Resurrected? Luke suggests it was Peter (Lk.24:34b-35a,) and John says it was John! (Jn. 20:9) Be that as it may, I believe Luke, author of "the Road to Emmaus," deserves his own Easter Feature in a church newsletter (Luke 24: 13-32) and so does John with Chapters 20 and 21 of his Gospel!

What I find most touching about Resurrection Sunday is how Our Loving Lord appeared first to Mary Magdalene, weeping alone early Sunday morning. She didn't recognize Him until He said her name! (John 20:11-16) Likewise, when Jesus appeared to Cleopus and his companion Sunday afternoon, walking from Jerusalem to Emmaus, they didn't know who He was, not even when, "beginning from Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself." (Luke 24: 27b) Not until that evening, when Jesus blessed the bread, broke it and gave it to them did they recognize the Risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! (Lk. 24: 31)

How often have we failed to recognize the Risen Lord Jesus in our midst? Even when He is right there waiting to listen to us, feed us and bless us!

May we, this Resurrection Sunday and from now on, recognize Christ with us, no matter where, no matter when, no matter with whom, and may we witness to the fact that He is Lord and Savior of all! Praise Jesus! He is risen indeed!

The title of this devotional is based on my most precious book from my Dad, Rev. W.T. Holland's pastoral library: Robertson, A.T., A Harmony of The Gospels for Students of The Life of Christ. Chicago: A.P. Blessing Co., 1922

This month's devotional brings to light an important aspect of Bible Study. Comparison. When we look at scripture, the Gospels in particular, we get an enhanced view of Our Savior. How do you experience Jesus? What part of His life and ministry do you tend to focus on? Just as the tables from the *Life Application Bible* below illustrate the different ways the disciples saw Jesus, each of our stories, as we share our walk with Christ, will be diverse perspectives all rendering a picture of the same Savior.

good report [admirable]; if there be any virtue [excellent], and if there be any praise [or praiseworthy], think on these things. (KJV) [NIV]

This is important because so many of our habits good and bad begin first in our thought life. This can also prompt a couple of questions we can ask ourselves: What's controlling me and what am I like? Fasting reveals what's going on with us that takes us off mission. Our cravings often lead us to enslavement.

Why do we fast?

The answer is simple. But it is not easy. We fast to get closer to God. To center on God. That should be our motivation. As we draw closer by denying ourselves, it surfaces what dominates us. In 1 Corinthians 9:24-27 Paul writes:

Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. Therefore I do not run like someone running aimlessly; I do not fight like a boxer beating the air. No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to

others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize.

On the prayer guide for the fast it states, "We fast to become more of who God has made us to be. We want to remove distractions and focus on having the spirit of Christ inhabit us. During the Journey to Becoming Fast, we will have an opportunity to grow individually and more importantly, as a covenant community with our eyes on fulfilling the mission of God."

The first week of the fast was shaky of me. I did a reboot starting in the second week and reading the designated scriptures, I was struck by 2 Corinthians 5:21 - God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might **become** the righteousness of God." If we are the righteousness of God, then what adjustments can fasting help us make in order to, in fact, BE God's righteousness?

The fast began on March 17th and continues until April 16th. However you have decided to fast during this time, whether you are fasting from food, social media, TV, sugar/sweets, let this be a time as you get closer to God through prayer and meditating on His word where you start to see how God is shaping you and molding you into becoming the person He wants to be who ready, willing and able to fulfill the Mission – to share Jesus and make disciples.

Episodes and types of Fasts in the Bible

- Matthew 4:1-4—Jesus ate no food for 40 days
- Partial Fast: Daniel 10:3—he ate no choice foods for 3 weeks. Mourned after a vision of war.
- Total Fast: Esther 4:16—no food or water for three days. This fast was for a national emergency.
- Total Fast: Acts 9:9 Saul aka Paul consumed no food or drink for 3 days after his conversion.



In a country that faces political turmoil, an uprise in Voodoo, and a lack of basic resources, Pastor Herode Guillomettre along with his wife Edline have been a Pillar of Hope in Haiti for over two decades. Pastor G, which he likes to be referred as, is not only an evangelist but a strong advocate for

education and social reform.

Pastor G. and Edline have built the Kingdom of God in Haiti by saving lives amid the chaos. Prayers make their Ministry strong and solid in that country despite all the adversities they have encountered. With all the obstacles that the Guillomettres' face, they are determined to never give up and to continue to do their Ministry work with joy and happiness knowing they are serving God. Pastor Guillomettre finds great comfort in Isaiah 43: 1-5 knowing that God is with him.

Pastor Guillomettre's Prayer requests are:

- Pray for our financial obligation this year to keep our schools open, especially for the schools of Deinlee and Leissa. This year is a challenge for us to pay the school and to meet our daily obligations. (Their monthly operating cost is \$2,500.00 US Dollars).
- Our church members have a lot of needs, please pray for them that God give them strength and courage to not abandon Him in their difficult time.
- Pray for Haiti's political, and security crisis marked by gang violence, economic turmoil, and widespread insecurity. Gang violence has severely impacted public services, including electricity, water, sanitation, health care, education, and transportation.

Springtime Renewal

ejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout in triumph, Daughter Jerusalem! Look, your King is coming to you; He is righteous and victorious, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. - Zechariah 9:9 (HCSB)

Each year regardless of the treacherous winter preceding it, cherry trees bloom in Central Park. I try to go see the ones along a beautiful stretch of trail where tall branches crowded with gorgeous pale pink flowers arch halfway across the path. When the breeze is strong, loose petals fall like heavy rain and flood the path with pink. A vision fit for a wedding. More than once I've been blessed to get caught in that tender storm, petals fluttering around in a whirl. Then they seem more like thousands of butterflies overwhelming me with their friendly introductions. I've always left there grinning and breathless.

In the depths of winter those same trees don't look



capable of that magnificent display. If anything, it seems the opposite. Like nothing good could come from them. Yet those forlorn-looking trees explode with the prettiest delicate flowers each year. They revive with such astonishing brilliance it's like they spent the whole winter stockpiling flowers, anxious to show them off come spring.

There is something touching and wonderful about Holy Week happening at this time of year, a reminder about death and Resurrection yet also the tumultuous road that led there.

Tornadoes happen most during spring. This season of hope and new beginnings is also when things are wildly stirred up. Yet frigid temperatures give way to warmth, hibernating animals awaken, green shoots sprout from formerly lifeless ground, trees and flowers come to life and they blanket fields and gardens with stunning color. Animals give birth to their young. Lambs and colts are born.

In spring, balmy mornings dawn after wintry nights like a victory. In spring, we commemorate the defeat of death

and sin, and celebrate the conquering Savior who rose from the dead in a tomb and stood alive in a garden. In spring, life thrives all around as if arising in honor of the coming King. Springtime, in quiet company, becomes our silent but joyous companion wordlessly reflecting this sacred season and unfolding to celebrate alongside us.
